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New Website for Information on Autism and Autism Spectrum Disorders

Albany- Individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASDs) and their families now have a single comprehensive resource to go to for important information on ASDs and the State services agencies available to address the needs of individuals and their families living with these diagnoses – the New York ACTS website – www.nyacts.org

New York ACTS (An Initiative for Adults and Children on the Spectrum) was developed in partnership with 11 State agencies, as a way to bring reliable, current information to the public about autism and to assist New York's families to easily find State services for their loved ones with ASD. Because individuals with ASD may need services from different systems – education, health, mental health and developmental disabilities services – NYACTS offers a dedicated site from which people can get the information they need without any prior knowledge of New York's service agencies.

In addition to information on autism and State services and supports for individuals and families, New York ACTS provides news stories related to ASD, the answers to frequently asked questions, and information on important laws, events and trainings, the network of university-affiliated resource centers for autism and related disabilities across the State, State autism initiatives, and profiles of citizens of all ages living with ASD. A cross-agency committee will regularly update and maintain the website as a means to bring the latest information to a wide range of parties.
